All entries will be accepted with the understanding that the PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC, members of the show committee and Claresholm Agriplex will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that in any way may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs, that may arise out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of any such horse.

PLEASE ensure that you have sufficient personal insurance coverage to supplement the coverage provided by the show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The shows are run under PHAC show rules and in any case where this Premium List appears to be in conflict with those rules, the PHAC Rules shall take precedence. Everything possible is being done to conduct this show on the highest possible level for the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudicating officials to be found have been selected and they will place awards on the horses as they see them presented in the ring, without regard to previous records and performances. The PHCBC and PHCA are most desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return ask for cooperation of all helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event.

All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions, descriptions of gear and attire, conduct and ethics, and conditions for this show are described in the following publications.

ALL EXHIBITORS, HANDLERS AND RIDERS and other persons participating in the show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of **ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1. The PHAC By-Laws
2. The PHAC Book of Peruvian Horse Showing 2013
3. The Peruvian Horse Breed Standard and PHAC Code of Ethics

MEMBERSHIP AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Non-Members of the PHAC are eligible to participate in this event and will not be charged any additional fees. Horses registered or pending with the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada are eligible to be shown. Horses owned by residents of Canada **MUST** be registered or pending with the PHAC. Horses owned by residents of other countries are eligible to be shown provided they are registered or pending with AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA. Owners in arrears with PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC or NAPHA will not be allowed to show until arrears are cleared.

APPROVAL& POINTS

The Wild West Classic is an event combining two separate Regional Championship shows. The PHCBC Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and the Wild Rose Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta. Each show is approved by the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada and will receive **DOUBLE POINTS** towards PHAC awards.

JUDGE'S AUTHORITY

The judge shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The Judge shall award first, second or third place, etc., according to merit, but shall award places starting with first and continuing in order in each class. This applies whether there are one or more entries in a class. If there are more horses of merit in a class than there are prizes offered in that class, the Judge has the right to award honorable mentions. The Judge has the right to make favorable comments over the public address system about the horses shown before him/her, but shall make no negative comments.

JUDGING PROCEDURE FOR THIS DOUBLE SHOW: The horses will be judged by both Judges, however the Judges will NOT CONFER; except in the event of dismissing a horse, the judges must confer and be unanimous. Any requests requiring the consent of the other Judge (such as for a short recess) shall be made through the Ring Steward, who will advise the other Judge and the Announcer.

A. REGULAR CLASSES: A Champion of Champions or Laureado(a) horse will not appear on the Judge's card, for that division, for a club in which it is a past Champion of Champions or Laureado(a).

B. CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: Horses that qualify in a regular class will be judged in the show in which it qualified.

C. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CLASSES: Past champions may go directly into the Champion of Champions classes for which they are qualified, along with the champions of the current year. The past National Champions of Champions will also be allowed to enter directly: NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOBPPH, and PHAC. A Laureado(a) horse will not appear on Judge's card, for that division, for the show in which it is Laureado(a).

RIBBONS AND AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded for first through fifth place in every class. Champions of Champions, Best Gait and Best Bozal will receive large neck ribbons. Large, distinctive ribbons will be awarded to Champions and Reserve Champions. Trophies will be awarded to Champions, Champion of Champions, Best Gait, Best Bozal and High Point Winners.

PLEASE NOTE: Displays of poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Anyone with a complaint or protest must file at the show office and arrange for an appointment with the official Show Steward.

SUBSTITUTION OF JUDGES AND OTHER OFFICIALS

In the event that the judge(s) (or other official(s) designated herein) is unable to perform his/her duties due to circumstances beyond his/her control or for any other reason, the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and/or the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta reserve the right to substitute another approved judge (or other official) in his/her place.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Horses from the United States will need a CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS report (Coggins test good for 6 months) and an INTERNATIONAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE endorsed by a Federal Veterinarian, showing examination within the 30 days prior to entering Canada. This paperwork can take as long as three weeks so please plan ahead. For further information contact the Canadian Veterinarian at Canada Customs at the border crossing of your choice. Please check for a current schedule to cross without an appointment or to set an appointment. **For veterinary health paper requirements, the physical address of Claresholm Agriplex is 5950 - 4 St. W, Claresholm, AB T0L 0T0**

DRUGS & FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES

Please be advised that mandatory random drug screening MAY be enforced at this show. There will be a \$5.00 fee to cover the cost of testing (included in ALL-IN-ONE fee). If a horse is randomly chosen, it is escorted to separate area where it must be kept until successful collection of a sample of blood or urine. Please also note:

- a) The exhibitor or his agent is to advise the Show Manager or Secretary in writing of all drugs administered in any fashion within (seventy-two) 72 hours prior to or during the show. This information is to be made available for inspection by anyone interested.
- b) No horse shall be eligible for competition in any class if it has been administered a forbidden substance, i.e. any stimulant, depressant, tranquilizer or local anesthetic which might affect the performance, temperament or courage of the horse. Also prohibited are any drugs which might mask or screen the presence of forbidden substances. Any horse entered in an approved show is subject to examination by the official show veterinarian. Such examinations may include physical, saliva, urine and blood. Refusal to submit a horse for examination and to cooperate with the official show veterinarian and technicians constitutes a violation and subjects the responsible person to penalties.

GATE RULE

The 3-minute gate rule will be strictly adhered to. Call for classes will be made well in advance, so be at the holding area and **CHECKED IN WITH THE RING ADMISSION STEWARD** before your class is going in the door. When a tack or attire change is required and an entry cannot make the 3-minute ruling, a request for additional time may be approved by the Show Manager or in his absence, the Ring Admission Steward, Show Secretary, or the Show Announcer prior to the start of judging.

NO ENTRY WILL BE PERMITTED INTO THE RING AFTER THE GATE HAS BEEN CLOSED.

LARGER CLASSES

Larger classes may be divided at the discretion of the Ring Master.

In the case of "pending registration", a copy of the application for registration must be included. Every entry form must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent. If signed by an agent, include a copy of the authorization.

SHOW OFFICE HOURS

The Show Office will be open Thursday, July 9 at 6 p.m. and one hour prior to the scheduled start of each morning and afternoon session. To give exhibitors additional time to add or change classes, the office will also be open half an hour prior to the start of each morning and afternoon intermission, but will close when the intermission starts. The intermission will be 10 minutes to allow the office time to print off judge's, ring steward's and gate admission steward's sheets.

CLASS ADDITIONS/SCRATCHES DURING THE SHOW

All "add on" classes must be made through the office during the times noted above.

Exhibitors may scratch from a class or substitute a handler/rider by advising the gate steward at least one class prior to the class you wish to scratch.

Rule IX Part II Section 16: Prueba Funcional

All horses entered to compete in a Champion of Champions class in Pleasure or Performance divisions must complete the prueba funcional prior to the Champion of Champions classes unless that horse has completed at least two (2) saddle classes.

All horses entered to compete in a Champion of Champions class in the Breeding/Luxury division must complete the prueba funcional prior to the Champion of Champions classes unless that horse has completed at least two(2) of the following saddle classes:

- 1) Any Gait class
- 2) Any Breeding/Luxury Stakes, Rancho/Breeders Conjunto Stakes
- 3) Any qualifying class for Champion or Reserve Champion
- 4) Champion and Reserve Champion

A list of qualifying horses that must complete the Prueba will be posted at the show office. If your horse qualifies, please report 15 minutes prior to your allotted time.

RULE IX Part II Section 6A: Novice Rider Definition

A Novice Rider will be defined as a person who on January 1st of the current year has:

1. never been a Professional under PHAC rules,
2. accumulated fewer than 150 cumulative points in the Junior and Novice division in PHAC or NAPHA approved shows
3. never won a Champion of Champions title.

RULE VIII Part III Section 1 and Section 2:

Mandatory Maneuvers in Pleasure Division Classes:

1. Walk on loose rein
2. Stop and stand quietly
3. Back up a minimum of five steps
4. Do complete small circles
5. Reversal of directions on the rail (done to the inside)
6. Straight line serpentines through obstacles (placed in a straight line).

Pleasure Optional (on rail or individually)

7. Figure 8's

Diameter for the circles and spacing for the serpentines will be approximately 3 to 4 metres (10 to 15 feet) using safe and stable obstacles set in an approximately straight line. All maneuvers should be performed with precision. The horse should remain relaxed, and nervousness will be penalized. Mandatory maneuvers must be performed in both directions. Individual workouts may be called for any and all places by the Judge. All horses chosen for workouts must be shown as requested by the Judge.

Mandatory Maneuvers in Performance Division Classes:

1. Walk – can be on loose rein or light contact, but not on tight rein
2. Stop and stand quietly
3. Back a minimum of five steps
4. Do complete small circles (to inside unless requested by judge toward rail)
5. Do reversals of directions on the rail (done to inside unless requested by judge toward rail)
6. Do serpentines through objects that are offset by 3 feet
7. Figure 8's
8. Side pass
9. Stop, and reverse in place on the haunches

Optional (on rail or individually)

10. Figure 6's
11. Spirals (caracol)
12. Turn on the haunches
13. Turn on the forehand

Diameter for the circles and spacing for the serpentines will be approximately 3 to 4 metres (10 to 15 feet) using safe and stable obstacles offset approx. 2 – 3 ft. Mandatory maneuvers must be performed in both directions. Individual workouts may be called for any and all places by the Judge. All horses chosen for workouts must be shown as requested by the Judge.

WWC CLASS DESCRIPTIONS/RULES

OPTIONAL RELAXED ATTIRE RULENew****

Optional "relaxed" attire choices will be allowed for specific divisions at this show to promote participation and allow exhibitors to switch it up!

The rules will apply to the following divisions:

Novice, Pleasure, Performance, Any NQ class (NOT luxury/breeding stakes) Western, English or Plantation tack is already allowed in these divisions.

Attire options may include riding jackets, vests, or shirt and tie, in any color. All colors of jeans, breeches or riding skirts will be allowed EXCEPT blue denim. A complimentary hat or helmet must be worn.

Tall boots, chaps or half chaps (polainas) are allowed. Boots may be worn on outside of pant. All should be in good taste and exhibit professionalism to our spectators!! THESE ARE NOT MANDATORY. THESE WILL NOT BE PERMITTED IN ANY LUXURY/BREEDING OR GAIT CLASSES.

SHOD HORSESNew****

Shod horses will be allowed to participate in the Versatility and Novice divisions. Please ensure that you do not enter your horse with shoes on in any other division (breeding/luxury/gait/pleasure/performance).

JUNIOR CLASSES

Helmets are mandatory for Junior riders in the 12 and under age category.

Leadline riders will be exempt from helmets provided there is a person leading and a person(s) spotting the rider.

The Junior Division will be split in two age groups where possible (12 years of age & under and 13 years of age & over). At the discretion of the Show Committee, the junior classes may be run simultaneously, however judging and ribbon presentation will remain separated. Bareback pads are optional in the Jr. Bareback Classes.

NOVICE DIVISION

A High Point Novice award will be presented to the exhibitor that has accumulated the most points in the qualifying classes at this show. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st-6 points, 2nd-5 points, 3rd-4 points, 4th-3 points, 5th-2 points, and all others participating - 1 point. Exhibitors with shod horses will be permitted to participate in this division but cannot participate in any other regular classes. Juniors are NOT allowed to compete in the Novice division. *****Shod horses will be allowed in this division as well as the Versatility division ONLY. Please ensure that you do not enter your horse with shoes on in any other divisions.*****

LUXURY GELDING STAKES - Entry Fee - \$100 (\$50/show).

To be judged as per Luxury Gelding rules and is open only to geldings born in North America. Prize money will be awarded from a percentage of the proceeds from entries and donations, to be divided as follows: 1st - 40%; 2nd - 25%; 3rd - 20%; 4th - 10%; 5th - 5%.

MYSTERY CASH BREEDING MARE/STALLIONS STAKES IN BIT

Entry Fee - \$20 (\$10/show). To be judged as per Breeding division rules. Mystery cash prizes to be awarded.

VINTAGE RIDER - Open to all horses (bit or bozal) ridden by those who are **55 Yrs.** of age or older by the date of the show. To be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

HIGH POINT and RESERVE VERSATILITY HORSE OF SHOW AWARD

CASH PRIZES

The entry with the highest number of points in their classes will be the High Point Versatility Horse of Show. Points will be awarded 1 – 6 (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). There is a cash award for High Point Versatility Horse as well as cash prizes in qualifying classes.

*****Shod horses will be allowed in this division as well as the Novice division ONLY. Please ensure that you do not enter your horse with shoes on in any other divisions.*****

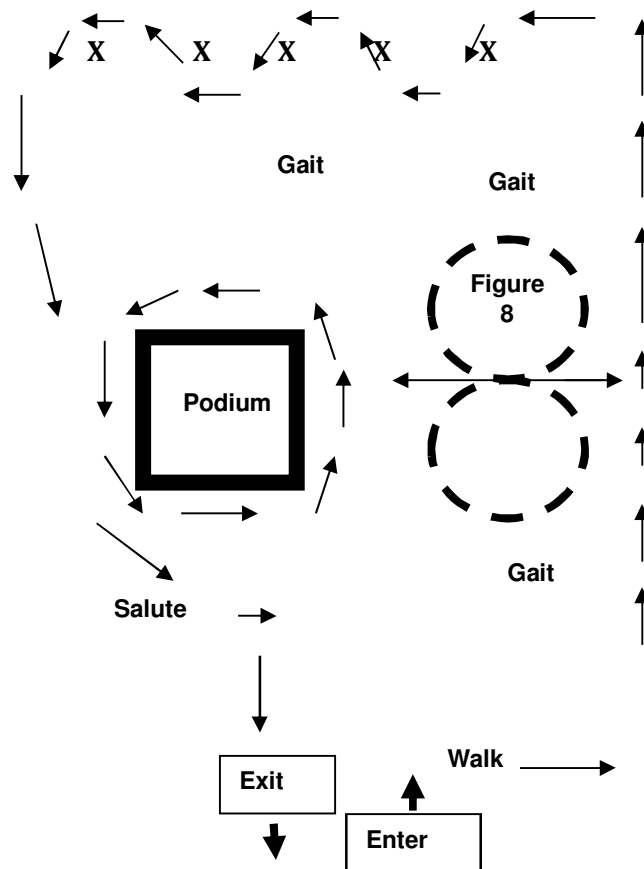

Dressage

Ties will be broken by the number of firsts and seconds. If there is still a tie, then the best placing in Synchronized Pairs determines the winner.

BOZAL PERFORMANCE Open to all bozal horses 3 & 4 years of age. Horses will be required to negotiate pattern below:



1. Enter arena
2. Halt and salute the Judges
3. Turn right, walk to rail
4. Continue on the rail in gait to mid- point of arena
5. Perform two (2) large figure 8's in gait starting at top of figure 8
6. Stop in center of last figure 8 and stand quietly for 10 seconds
7. Back 3 to 5 steps. Walk forward to rail
8. Proceed to cones in gait and serpentine through, staying in gait
9. Circle the judge's podium
10. Gait back to exit. Halt and salute the Judges and proceed out of the arena.

SYNCHRONIZED PAIRS in Bit or Bozal -Versatility Qualifier \$\$

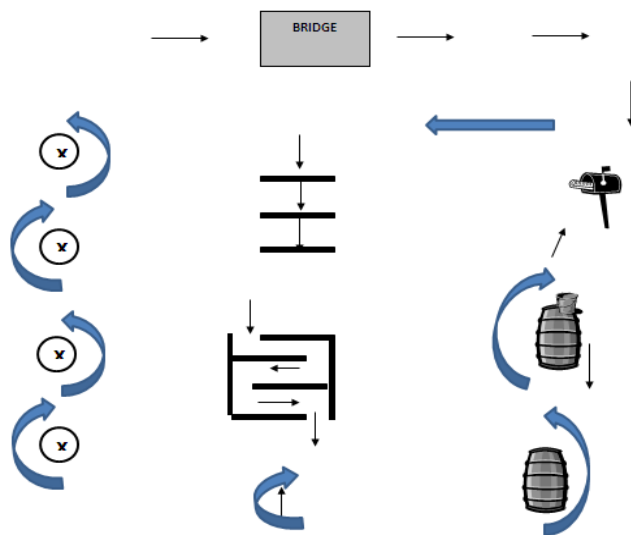
Open to horses in bit or bozal, amateur or professional rider. To be judged on similarity of attire and performance of both horses performing as one.

ENGLISH/WESTERN OPEN - Versatility Qualifier \$\$

Open to all horses (bit or bozal) amateur or professional riders, ridden under either English or Western tack. Judged as pleasure class.

TRAIL in Bit or Bozal - Versatility Qualifier \$\$

Horses required to negotiate pattern below. Retrancas optional.



1. Enter and salute Judge
2. Serpentine through cones in gait
3. Walk across bridge
4. Gait to barrel, pick up water bucket & place on second barrel
5. Back in between barrels and back around first barrel
6. Walk to mail box. Get mail and show to judge
7. Side pass six steps, stop and stand quietly for 10 seconds
8. Walk over poles
9. Walk through labyrinth
10. Turn on forehand to the left 180°. Salute judge and exit arena

GAITED DRESSAGE - Versatility Qualifier \$\$

Open to all horses in bit only, amateur or professional riders. Any tack is acceptable. Relaxed attire rules optional. Horse and rider will complete the dressage pattern that will be scored by the judge. Collective marks will be awarded for the following:

Gaits: walk/paso llano – quality, freedom and regularity.

Impulsion: desire to move forward, elasticity of steps, suppleness of the back, engagement of hindquarters.

Submission: acceptance of bit, attention and confidence, lightness and ease of movements.

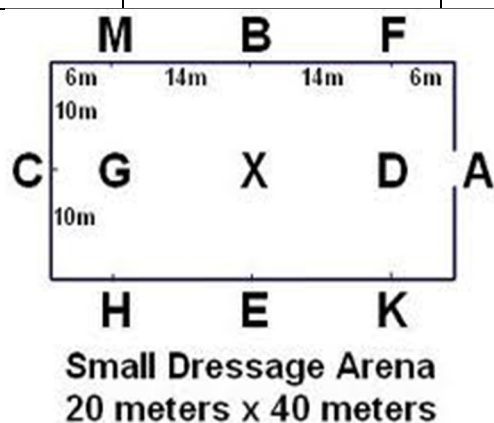
Rider: position and seat, correct and effective use of the aids. Looking for overall harmony between rider and horse.

2015 Gaited Dressage Test Introductory Level

Test Objective: Show that the horse can be ridden on a light but steady contact and be allowed freedom to lower and stretch his head and neck at the free walk.

Conditions: small arena (20x40m); average time 5 min.

	TEST	DIRECTIVE
1 A X	Enter Medium walk Halt, Salute Proceed at Medium walk	Quality of walk; Straightness on centreline; Straightness of halt; immobility; Quality of gaits and smoothness of transitions.
2 C	Track right	Balance and smoothness of turn; Quality of Medium walk.
3 M	Paso Llano	Balance and smoothness of transition; Quality of Paso Llano.
4 B	Circle right 20 m	Quality of Paso Llano; Shape and size of circle; Horse bends in the same shape as the circle.
5 Between B&F	Develop Medium walk	Balance and smoothness of transition; Quality of Medium walk.

Definitions of the Gaits:

Medium walk: This walk has to be clear, regular and unconstrained. The horse remains on the bit while the rider maintains a light, soft and steady contact with the mouth, allowing the natural movement of the horse's head and neck. The horse walks energetically but calmly forward, with even and determined steps and a moderate lengthening that allows his hind feet to touch the ground in front of the print of his forefeet. (Equine Canada and Practical Horseman)

Free walk: The free walk is a pace of relaxation in which the horse is allowed complete freedom to lower and stretch out his head and neck. The degree of ground cover and length of strides with hind feet stepping clearly in front of the footprints of the front feet are essential to the quality of the free walk (Equine Canada). The free walk is to be performed on a loose rein (with a loop in the rein and no contact). The horse should maintain an energetic, ground-covering attitude; the longer his strides, the better. This walk should be characterized by mental and physical relaxation (Practical Horseman).

Paso Llano: It is a 4-beat lateral gait that is executed with precisely the same timing between each of the four footfalls in a 1-2-3-4 rhythm. The horse executing the paso llano moves his hind leg forward, then his fore leg on the same side, then the hind leg on the other side followed by the fore leg on that side. The horse should be up in the front and under in the back.
