Rules and Regulations

The PHCBC is proud to present the 1st All Gaited Versatility Challenge!!!

The Versatility Challenge is a fast-paced competition, that is made up of Five Challenges: Pole Bending, 60 foot Back Up, Pleasure Class, Champagne and Trail Challenge. There will be two levels of competition. Level 1 is a Gaited division you may only ride in walk and middle gait. Level 2 is an open division you may ride in all gaits, walk, trot, middle gait, canter, etc.

The highest pointed rider will be awarded in level 1 \$500 and level 2 \$500.

Sunday June 9, 2019 Registration 7:00-7:45am, no pre entry. Event start time 8:00am Sharp. Armstrong Fairgrounds. Entry fee, non members \$80, PHBC member \$65.

General

All forms must be completed and signed 15 minutes prior to event start time. Registration 7:00am to 7:45am, no pre entry, event starts at 8:00am. All riders must be members of Horse Council BC (HCBC) and provide proof.

The same horse may be entered into the same event or different level with a change in rider. Points will be accumulated for each horse/rider combination. The Rider may enter more than 1 horse in any event. Entry fees must be paid for each horse/rider combination.

Horses must be saddled prior to each event. Gate will be held for 1 minute after call; list of order will be called 3 riders at a time with number order remaining same the for day.

The Pleasure event will be run once per level and may split by judge or show manager.

Stallions may not be shown or handled by Juniors (18 and under as of January 1st)

Horses may be light shod or barefoot.

Events or Levels may be cancelled by show manager if less then 3 participants.

Points

Points to be awarded:

First place 10 points, Second Place 9 points, Third Place 8 points, Forth place 7 points, fifth place 6 points.

Your top three placing will determine your end of day score.

Pole Bending - timed event and will be placed according to your time, 1^{st} to 5^{th} Backup Challenge – "complete" or "DQ" event, if completed you will receive 10 points. Pleasure - pointed event 1^{st} to 5^{th}

Champagne – qualifying heats, pointed in the final heat 1st to 5th

Trail Challenge - points will accumulate over your 2 min time limit, plus gambler (double or nothing).

If tie with end of day points, you will be placed according to the fastest time in pole bending. If tie or no entry in this event, then the most points in the Trail Challenge will be used.

Points are awarded to the top 5, horse/rider combinations by level.

Your top 3 highest pointed events out of the 5 total events will determine your placement in the overall score by level for the GVC.

Level 1

Level one will be a gaited division. You may only ride in walk and middle gaits. In the event you advance past your middle gait you will be disqualified. There will be 3 GVC officials and/or the honourable judge to make the judgement call.

Level 2

Level two you will be able to ride in all gaits, walk, trot, middle gait, gallop etc.

Arena

Any and all immediate judgments will be made by 3 of the GVC arena officials and/or honourable Judge.

Each participant must be ready when called or may be disqualified from event, after 1 minute. A fall is when either the rider is not astride of the horse or the horses' shoulder or haunch has touched the ground and will result in a disqualified event.

Re-rides will only be permitted due to equipment failure.

Horse and rider must enter the arena under full control. When exiting, the gate will not be opened until horse has come to a complete stop.

Tack and Attire

Peruvian Gear

Peruvian tack may be used, bozal or bridle and saddle must be Peruvian type. Halter and Tapa Ojos (optional). You may use leather stirrups. No Retrancas, Floron (optional). Must have Crupper.

Attire Includes: Collared shirt and white or black jean pants. Riding boots and belt. Peruvian hat and scarf (optional) Peruvian attire must be worn in all events. Attire must be neat and tidy during events.

Western Gear

Western tack may be used, hackamore or bridle and saddle must be western type.

Attire Includes: Collared long sleeve western shirt, long pants, riding boots and belt. Western hat (Optional) Western attire must be worn in all events.

English Gear

English tack may be used, bridle and saddle must be of English type.

Attire includes: Long sleeve shirts, long pants (breeches) and riding boots. Hat or helmet (optional). Attire must be neat and tidy during events. English attire attire must be worn in all events.

Riders 12 and under must wear a helmet in all events.

Animals

Cruelty to animals will not be permitted. Riders will be disqualified for the day and lose all points accumulated for that day.

Examples of cruelty can be but is not limited to the following: Excessively whipping, kicking, beating or spurring. Riding an exhausted or lame horse.


Class list:

Pole Bending, Backup Challenge, Pleasure Class, Champagne, Trail Challenge.

Pole Bending:

This is a timed event, the rider weaves a path around 6 poles arranged in a line (can start either side). Total measurement 126'


Breaking time barrier or pattern results in a DQ, 5 second time faults will be given if poles are knocked down.



Backup Challenge:

In this event you will have 2 minutes to ride down and back your horse between ground poles, front feet much pass end of poles before backing. This event is a complete or disqualification challenge, stopping or knocking a pole will result in a DQ.

From start line you will back 60'



Pleasure class:

All horses shall be shown at the horse's middle gait both directions of the ring and otherwise as requested by the Judge. The following maneuvers shall be mandatory in Pleasure Classes in order to demonstrate tractability and good manners.

Mandatory on rail prior to any class cut:

- Walk on loose rein
- 2. Stop and stand quietly
- 3. Back up a minimum of five steps

- 4. Do complete circles
- 5. Do reversals of directions on the rail
- 6. Straight line serpentine through obstacles

Optional maneuvers (on rail or individually)

- 7. Do figure 8's
- 8. Level 2 ask for a canter

Diameter for the circles and spacing for the serpentines will be approximately 3 to 4 metres (10 to 15 feet) using safe and stable obstacles. All maneuvers should be performed with precision. The horse should remain relaxed, and nervousness will be penalized. Mandatory maneuvers must be performed in both directions.

Individual workouts may be called for any and all places by the Judge. All horses chosen for workouts must be shown as requested by the Judge. The speed at which the horses are shown will be at the discretion of and completely under control of the Judge. The Judge may request different speeds of an individual horse during workout to test the horse's thread but excessive speed will not be required. Horses must be ridden throughout the entire class by only one and the same person.

In the lineup, the horses may be backed individually or as a group. Horses should not be stretched on the line.

Champagne:

All entries will receive equal quantities of champagne in identical glasses. Contestants will be divided into heats. The heats will consist of 2 laps of the arena with a time limit to be posted. The first and second place from each heat will move onto a final heat. Event to be judged on the amount of champagne remaining in the glass at the conclusion of your event, as measured by the Judge and/or his assistants.

Trail Challenge:

In this event you will have 2 minutes to complete/or attempt to complete the entire course, then you may use 3 or more obstacles to gain points until your 2 minutes is up. You will receive 5 points per completed obstacle. Any obstacles not completed or knocked over will receive no points.

There will be a Gambler obstacle at the end of your 2 minute run you will have 30 seconds the complete the "GAMBLER". This obstacle you will either double your points or you will lose all your points for this event. This is an optional obstacle. You may make your decision after your 2-minute run.

Trail Challenge

Pass over trap.

Pass over ground poles.

Pass through ribbon tunnel.


Pass through car wash.

Ride around barrel inside chalk.

Pass over bridge.

Pass through balloon obstacle.


