



BETWEEN THE EARS (BTE)

Recreational Riding Program By the PHAC

Program Rules

- 1. Riders must be PHAC members in good standing for the year hours are logged/ submitted.
- 2. BTE is FREE to all PHAC members in good standing.
- 3. Riders must register for the **BTE**. Only hours logged after registered will be allowed.
- 4. **BTE** runs from January 1st to December 31st.
- 5. Hours logged accumulate and are carried over to the next year.
- 6. There is no time limit. Go at your own pace.
- 7. Hours in the saddle are logged. Hours spent on groundwork may be counted at ½ weight.
- 8. Recreational riding includes all pleasure, trail, arena, demos, parades, drill team, ranch/farm work. Riding of any kind at any competitive PHAC or NAPHA approved show is not allowed.
- 9. Hours in the saddle at clinics is allowed, time spent on ground work is allowed at ½ weight.
- 10. Hours may be rounded up to the next .25 hour.
- 11. BTE is conducted on the "Honour System".
- 12. BTE is open to all amateurs, novices and juniors. No professionals.
- 13. Only purebred Peruvian Paso horses registered with either **PHAC or NAPHA** may be used to log hours. NAPHA registered Part Bloods may also be used.
- 14. Each rider is limited to using a maximum of 4 horses to log hours. Horses may be added or deleted or exchanged as needed at any time. Notify **BTE** at info@phac.ca of these changes.
- 15. IMPORTANT!! Please remember to log hours for *EACH HORSE* separately.
- 16. Riders do not have to own the horse(s) used to log hours.
- **17.** Submit hours to the Program Coordinator by email at info@phac.ca once milestones are achieved and **Win**Prizes.
- 18. Milestones are set at 50/100/250/500/750/1000 Hours.
- 19. Log the most hours for the year and receive the top award.
