Poncho Negro – Rocky Mountain Challenge – 2008 Canadian Nationals By Cyndi Rowat

At twenty-three years of age, Poncho has become more accustomed to which patch of grass he'd prefer to graze rather than chasing down any competitors on the trail but one thing his people Brent, Cyndi, Austin and Mason Rowat noticed over the last few years was that he still loves to be ridden and has not lost that exuberance for a good run. Now Austin's horse, Poncho has spent some enjoyable times going for mountain walks and strolls in the hayfield with his new young rider. But going from the leisurely pasture life to trail competitions might be a stretch for most horses, but then, Poncho is no ordinary horse, he is a Peruvian Horse.

As a member of the Canadian Nationals organizing committee hosting endurance, competitive trail and ride and tie trail events, Cyndi's plans to compete in the 80-mile Open competitive trail ride were thwarted when her Open horse was sidelined with an injury. Out for the training part of the season and the first month and a half of the competitive season, even just riding at the Nationals was becoming a distant dream.

Doing the ride n' tie would be fun and would take her mind off the fact she would not be vying for an individual medal in the Open event. Gazing out into the pasture one June morning her eyes rested upon her now flea-bitten grey Peruvian, Poncho. Brent would never do a ride n' tie on her Arabian....but maybe he would do it on Poncho! With a great deal of excitement, Cyndi stewed on this idea for a week or so prior to broaching the subject with her husband.

"No." was his curt reply. "We're not in shape." Brent insisted. "We'll come in last." "Why do you want to do that anyway?"

"Because...I think it'll be fun." Cyndi insisted. The entry was post-dated on the last day for entries and Poncho's status was upgraded from occasional walks in the mountains and around home to training for a ten mile ride n' tie with only four short weeks to go.

A ride n' tie is where teams with two riders and a horse race over a pre-determined course. Only one rider may benefit from the horse at a time. The other rider must run unassisted by the horse in any way, no tailing, and no hanging off the tack. The race starts with horses and runners heading out on the trail. Teams may plan their ride strategy based on their particular teams' strengths and weaknesses or compete with absolutely no planning at all. The horses surge on ahead, leaving most of the runners in the dust. Somewhere down the trail, the riders will dismount, tie the horse and continue on down the trail. The horse waits patiently for the runner to catch up to them (or not). The runner then mounts up and rides on to pass the teammate further on down the trail and so they continue with this piggyback method of locomotion.

With a total age of 108 years between the three-member team, Brent and Cyndi figured on beating some friends in the race with their trusty side-kick Poncho and were determined NOT to finish last.

RACE DAY

The weather was picture perfect, with early morning cold, some cloud cover and a gentle warming trend on drying trails after the previous day's downpour. Wearing worn-out riding runners with plans to splash through the mud rather than worry about picking through it, I let Poncho set his pace out the start gate... within speed barrier limits...and headed for the first climb just as Brent and I had planned.

Cresting the hill for long enough for Poncho to recover, I looked for a solid tree and tied Poncho to it. Saying Whoa several times to ensure he had no plans of following; I headed off down the trail. I sure thought this trail went a lot faster when I rode the endurance ride on Friday, I thought to myself as I puffed and pounded through the forest. A runner glided by me with barely a breath, slipping down the trail effortlessly.

Then, I heard the familiar paca-paca behind me. "Do you want to ride or can you meet at the bottom?" "I'm good." I puffed, determined to run to the base of the hill as planned.

Finally, the hill was within my sight. This will be fun! Letting gravity do most of the work, I worked on staying balanced as I took long strides to the bottom. (You were thinking I was going to fall there, weren't you!) Catching up to Poncho was a relief. I jumped on and let Poncho fly. While he did his thing, I tanked up with Gatorade and prepared for my next stretch on foot thinking smugly, what an advantage to ride a Peruvian! Two more switches on the trail before heading into the 5-mile vet check. Brent handed Poncho off to a volunteer where he would wait for me and took off on foot to see how much trail he could tackle before Poncho and I caught up again.

Poncho had to recover to 16 beats per minute. He had a little time before I got there but it didn't help. He was so wound up and ready to go it took us an extra excruciatingly painful five more minutes before he pulsed down. I was so far behind I wondered if Brent would finish the last leg without us.

He didn't, we did catch him and switched a few more times on our ten-mile adventure. I think I grinned and smiled the whole time! When we started heading toward the finish, I was on foot. We knew we had lots of teams banging on our back door, so we didn't want to risk another switch, so I kept running. The exuberant cheering spectators helped me bang out the final distance with Brent and I having a last-stretch challenge to see who would finish first, him or me! I still haven't seen the video of the finish to declare boasting rights.

What a blast!!

So, were we last? Did it matter? Of course it mattered!

We finished in 1 hour and 32 minutes, two minutes behind the winners – remember Mr. Stealth mode in the forest? Yeah, he's a marathon runner. He and his wife beat us. But we are SO hooked! We're already talking about doing another ride n tie next year but hopefully we'll be a little more physically prepared.

Are you up for the challenge?

UPDATE

Since we had such a blast at Nationals, we took Poncho through the Rockies to Skimikin Lake, B.C. and completed a 25 mile endurance ride together. It's the first time we've competed together since Austin was born in 1996. We didn't break any speed records, but Poncho got his completion and we're all very excited about the new face of his 'retirement'.



My name is Casanita but all my friends call me "Cassie". I am a Peruvian Paso mare owned by the Rosia family in Okotoks Alberta. My story begins on Friday, October 2, 2009, the day I left home and embarked on a three day journey to Texas to the U.S. National Show. Actually, it really started in October 2008. You see, Annie (the youngest Rosia) is a junior rider who has been showing Peruvian horses for several years on her horse named Royal. They worked great together and had competed for several years but 2009 would be different. Royal was pregnant and expecting a baby in the spring of this year so Annie would need a new horse to ride if she wanted a shot at winning the annual High Point Junior trip to the US Nationals in Texas. I was inexperienced and very much out of shape and was still only in Bozal even though I was ten years old. I would need a lot of work if I was going to fill in for Royal. Hers were big horseshoes to fill!! With lot of help from our trainer Grant McKinney, Annie worked with me over the next 9 months. She put me in the bit herself, got me back into shape and we practiced our manoeuvres over and over again. We rode together for the 2009 show season and at the Canadian Nationals, we learned that, yes; Annie and I were Texas bound.

I was loaded on Ringstead's trailer on that Friday and headed south. I enjoyed all the new scenery as our route took us through Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico and then into Texas. Our first night on the road, we overnighted at the Rodeo Grounds in Casper Wyoming. Our second night, we stayed in Amarillo Texas at the Big Texan Steak Ranch / Horse Hotel, home of the 72 Ounce Steak. If you can eat it all, it's FREE! If not, it'll cost ya \$72.00 and you don't get to add your name to their Wall of Fame. That's me standing next to the giant steer on the left!!!





The facilities were more than comfortable and I had a great night's rest and the next morning I was ready for the last leg of our trip to Rancho El Refugio in Granbury Texas where we were to stay until the show. Marco & Rusti Dapelo were great hosts and gave me a wonderful stall to hang out in where I



could rest up after so many hours on the road. Thank You So Much!

After a few days of R&R, we moved to the Will Rogers Memorial Centre in Fort Worth and I was finally reunited with my Annie who had just flown in with mom and Dad. It was great to see her again, I really missed her. Annie took me on a tour of the show arena, gave me my bath, and then we anxiously awaited our first class. How would we do? Could we compete against the American Juniors? We were about to find out.

We had a large cheering section, so big in fact; it brought a tear to my big brown eyes. I would do anything for my Annie and I think it's safe to say that yes, we did great, winning Reserve High Point Junior and Champion Open Performance Mare.
