WELCOME TO THE SHOW!

PHAC APPROVED

Greetings exhibitors! The Board of the Northwest Peruvian Horse Club, and the Show Committee, welcome you. We are proud to host the 41st Annual Northwest Regional Championships, one of the longest-running Peruvian Horse Shows in North America!

This show is **drug-free**. NAPHA has changed its drug policy. Previously there was a “zero tolerance” rule for positive test results, coupled with a 7-day recommendation for non-use before a show. With testing procedures becoming more finite, NAPHA recognizes the inappropriateness of that policy. NAPHA now defers to the USEF rules. While there may be a “positive” test, the potential exists for the displayed amount to be far less than therapeutic levels, not to a degree that can mask injury or enhance performance. Additionally, 4 vials will now be pulled for additional tests as needed. This adheres to the standard of NET (no effect threshold) testing. The NPHC welcomes this change, since it avoids punishing exhibitors, and their animals, for administering needed therapeutic medications weeks before the show. Many medications, such as phenylbutazone (Bute), are measurable in the bloodstream by modern techniques, such as HPLC, many weeks after administration, when the ability of the drug to affect performance has long since dissipated.

APPROVAL & POINTS

This show is approved by the North American Peruvian Horse Association (NAPHA). This show will earn a minimum of double points for NAPHA Awards if the recorded owner(s) of the horse is/are a current NAPHA member at the time of the show –Year-end Awards – Medallon de Oro, Medallon de Bronze, and the new NAPHA Lifetime Award – Medallon de Diamonte. This show is also approved by the **PHAC for single points, except where a minimum of 15 PHAC Registered horses owned by at least 4 different PHAC registered owners attend the show, in which case, a double points value will be applied.** Qualified entries will receive points toward annual and lifetime awards. All participants **must** present both sides of registration papers or proof of registration pending for every horse entered in this show, as well as proof of placings for direct entry into Ch of Ch classes.

NEW THIS YEAR: FRIDAY FUN NIGHT – 7 pm in the Main Arena. \$30 to Enter and Pay at the door – All types of different Fun Classes to include: Barrel Racing, Egg Stomp, Tree Grab, and Ride a Five - \$5 minimum or any other denomination you want to ride with. The winner takes all the cash.

Attention New Exhibitors!

If you have questions about showing, tack, show rules, etc., the NPHC would like to provide some advice and assistance. We will try to find a seasoned exhibitor to be your “coach” before and during the show. Entry Fees

The unlimited fee is intended to act as an incentive to encourage people to enter more classes than they might otherwise do at a class-by-class rate. It applies to juniors and adults. It also eases the burden of the office staff by rewarding those who pay one time in advance. If you have entered at the single class rate and wish to upgrade to the flat fee rate, you may do so by paying the unlimited fee, however previously entered classes will not be credited toward that fee. We do **not** require payment to be submitted with your entry form. It is hoped that this will encourage you to enter as many horses as you think might attend. Your payment at the show will reflect only the horses you bring. No vet excuse is required, however, a one-time late fee of \$25 per horse will be charged for horses not entered by the **Deadline, which is July 17th**.

Shavings Fee Disposal fee - \$20 per stall for the entire weekend

Pine shavings will be provided in bulk. There will be a \$20 per stall Shavings Fee to help cover the cost of the shavings. This is a one-time fee, per stall, for the entire weekend.

Stall Fees - \$40 per night, Tack Stall \$35 per night

Stalls are available from Wednesday through Monday morning, including bedding. Tack stalls have no bedding. If you arrive Wednesday and do not use the tack stall until Thursday, no charge for Wednesday. Likewise, if you clear your tack stall on Sunday afternoon, no charge for Sunday night. Stalls **MUST BE STRIPPED** of all bedding when you leave. Exhibitors should contact Tia Statia at: 360-929-0767 statia_34@hotmail.com, in advance with your stall requirements. Each horse entered must be assigned a separate stall, except mares with suckling foals, and must be placed in stalls as assigned. No showing out of trailers. Stalls containing horses **must not** be locked. Dogs must be kept on a leash.

Post Entries

***** Entries must be received by July 17th**, in order to avoid a late penalty of \$25 per horse. **DO NOT mail your entry after July 17th**. Entries should then be **SCANNED** to: willie-jj@hotmail.com or brought to the show, and will incur a one-time \$25 late fee per horse. Fees need not be paid until arrival at the show. Exhibitors wishing to add classes must do so a minimum of 3 classes in advance. Notify the office or the Gate Steward.

RV & Camping

RV parking & camping are available at \$30 per day w/o hookups or \$35 per day with power & water. Spaces are on a first-come, first-served basis. No reservations. You can hold a spot for a friend.

Display & Vendor Space and Premium & Business Sponsorships

There is a charge of \$100 for anyone selling anything (inside or outside arena – NO power) and \$125 (inside or outside arena – WITH power) for the duration of the show Friday – Sunday. Fees are Non-refundable. Contact Tia Statia – 360-929-0767 or Email: statia_34@hotmail.com (email preferred) for reservations. **Premium Sponsorship** – Ranches or vendors may place a banner in the arena for \$150 for the duration of the show and place ranch or vendor info/cards on the hospitality table. **Business Sponsorship** – Place business info/cards on the hospitality table for \$125.

Membership & Registration Requirements

Horses registered with the NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOPPH, or PHAC are eligible to enter this show. **Both** sides of the registration papers for each horse **must** accompany entries. **Proof of eligibility** to enter directly into Ch of Ch classes **must** also be included. The NPHC reserves the right to decline any entry. Anyone not in good standing with NAPHA may not enter this show. Exhibitors are not required to be members of the above organizations. Horses registered with multiple organizations should supply all papers.

Registered Owner

The name on the certificate of ownership, issued by the NAPHA, AAOBPPH, PPHRNA, or PHAC must match the horse that the certificate is issued. If the horse is owned by a ranch, corporation, or family trust, the individuals' names must be registered with NAPHA. Lessees will not be allowed to show leased horses in classes where only the owner is allowed to ride.

Refunds – Please Note:

Entry fees are not due until arriving at the show. Charges will be based on horses actually brought to the show and no vet excuse is required. If a horse is present on the show grounds and deemed unable to perform, a veterinary statement must be presented to the Show Secretary prior to the end of the show in order to obtain a refund of class fees, only. No refund after one class has been entered. Purse class fees will not be refunded unless the horse is removed from the remainder of the show with a veterinary statement.

Class Changes and Substitutions

If a horse entered is unable to perform, another horse may be substituted. A horse may also be moved from one class to another. In each instance, the Gate Steward **must be notified 3 classes in advance**, but no fee will be charged. Changing riders or handlers is also free, but the same notice must be given.

Ribbons

Rosette ribbons are awarded to fifth place in all classes. Championship classes will be awarded neck ribbons and trophies.

Foals

No horses are to be allowed to run free, including foals, regardless of age.

Conduct

Each exhibitor will display their horse in the most natural way possible and suitably maintain their horse. **NO SMOKING** is permitted in or around the barn areas. Dogs must be kept on a leash. Only participants in the class, the judge, and Ring Steward and their assistants will be permitted to enter the arena. Attendants are not permitted in the arena unless summoned by the Judge or when specified in this Premium. Anyone entering the arena as an attendant must be dressed in a white shirt and pants. Under no circumstances may the Judge be approached during classes. Any person or horse may be barred from entering the ring if not suitably presented. No one may make any remark or commit acts during the show that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging. Any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense. Acts of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of an owner, rider, handler, or member of the family participating in the show may disqualify them or their horses from adjudication. The management may remove any of the aforementioned persons from the show without being liable for compensation or damages. The NPHC reserves the right to decline any entry.

Sales Presentation

There will be a presentation of horses for sale after class 11. The enclosed form must be completed for all horses presented and a \$40 fee paid for each animal **not entered in a class at the show**. See the form for further requirements.

Judges' Authority

The Judges shall have the authority to place a horse in whatever position they believe the merit of the horse justifies. They must, however, award places according to merit starting with 1st and continuing in order. This applies whether there is one entry or many. If there are more horses of merit in a class than prizes, the Judges have the right to award any number of Honorable Mentions. The Judges' decisions as to the placing of horses in a class are final. Under no circumstances will exhibitors be allowed to discuss their standings with the Judges.

Judges' Option

The Judge may ask to ride any horse entered under saddle, in Breeding Division classes, but **not** in Performance Division. **The judge cannot ride anyone's horse unless it's in the Barrida and you have given permission for the judge to do so.** The Judges will not be responsible for any injury that the horse may sustain during this time. Likewise, the owner will not be responsible for any injury that the Judges may suffer resulting from their riding a horse.

Interaction with the Judges

Please join us in extending a warm welcome to our Judge, Janic Arllentar. We would like to make him feel welcome at our show and encourage everyone to get to know her. We ask, however, that all exhibitors respect the Judge's professionalism and ethics and understand that this is of the utmost importance. We invite appropriate interaction with all show officials, and while it is not our intent to isolate the Judge at social functions, we must insist that any questions regarding particular horses, placings at the show, one's performance, or anything about this show be directed to our Show Steward. There will be a chance to meet with, and question, Janic Arllentar on Thursday at 7:00 pm.

Meet with the Judge – 7:00 pm Thursday

This will be a question-and-answer period with Janic Arllentar. It will be an excellent chance for exhibitors to query the Judge on points of showing and judging that will help make the show a more rewarding experience. Following the Q&A the Juniors will have a chance for a one-on-one with the Judge.

Substitution of Judge or Other Officials

The NPHC Reserves the right to substitute another approved Judge or other officials in place of those listed in this premium.

Call for Classes

Classes will be announced 3 classes in advance. Three minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring. If a tack or attire change requires a gate hold, the Gate Stewart, must be notified in advance. No one may enter the arena after the gate has closed.

Responsibility

All entries are accepted with the understanding that the NPHC, NAPHA, and the grounds and arena owners will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage, or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs, that may arise out of an injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of any other person in charge of any such horse.

Prueba Funcional

NAPHA Rules forbid requiring completion of a Prueba Funcional for entry into Championship classes, therefore this show will not require one.

Cross Entries

Horses are permitted to enter both Breeding and Performance Division classes, but may not show in both bit and bozal in the same show.

Artificial Markings

Only clear grooming materials are allowed on the hide or hair except that white powder may be used on white markings. Clear grooming materials may be used on hooves, but black may not. Artificial mane or tail pieces are prohibited.

Shoes

NAPHA rules do not allow shoes.

Health Requirements

Washington State requires horses entering the state to have an official health certificate or Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days of shipment and a negative Coggins test within 12 months. Exempt are equines under 6 months of age accompanying a negative dam.

On Call. She will be required to identify any horse that exhibits symptoms of disease or lameness. If, upon mandatory inspection, the horse is found to be contagious or considered a danger to other animals, it must be removed from the showgrounds or quarantined.

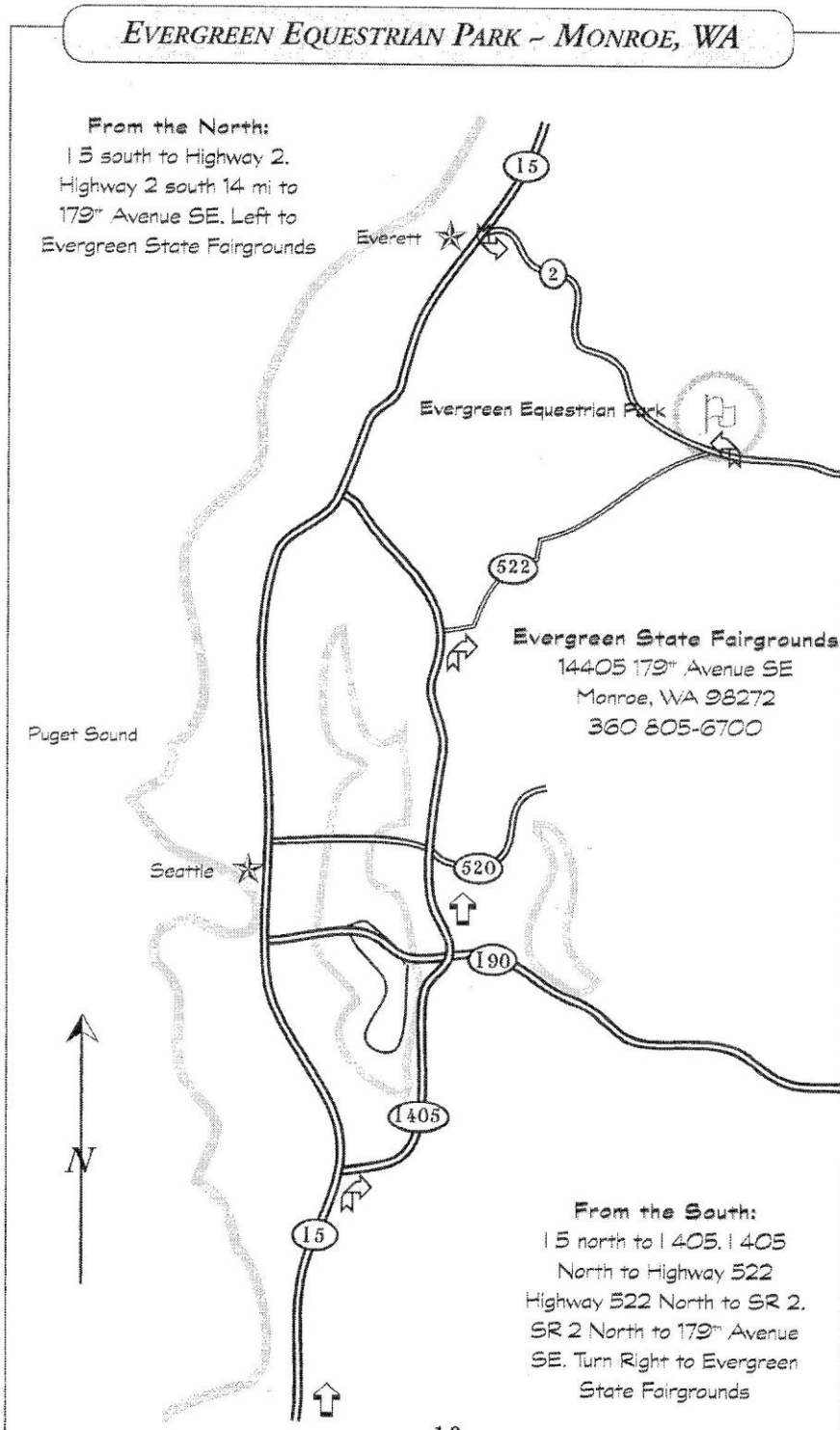

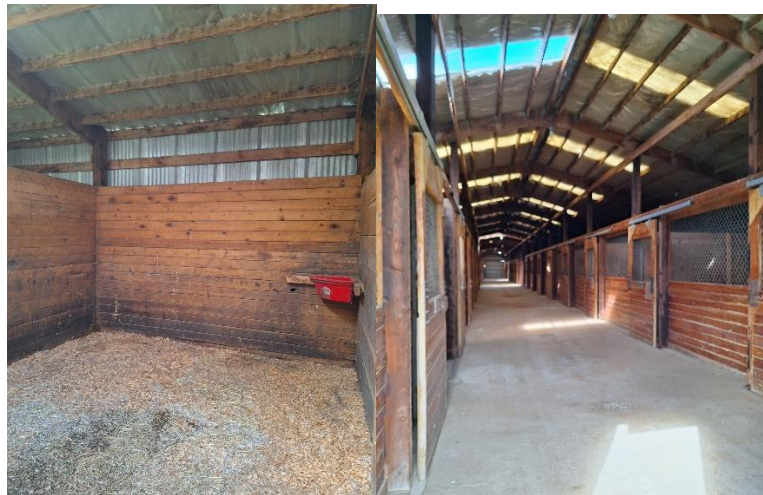

Oak Harbor is one (1) hour North of Monroe and 5 hours from the site of the Canadian National Show, two weeks later in Armstrong BC. RULES FOR CLASSES

Rules and Regulations

All participants should be familiar with the NAPHA Rules and Regulations of Horse Showing and Peruvian Breed Standards, available from NAPHA online at: <https://www.napha.net/forms-rules/> or by calling: 434-238-4607. The highlights are contained herein, but exhibitors will need to be familiar with all aspects of the rules.

Tack and Attire

All Breeding, Luxury qualifying, Performance, and Championship classes are Peruvian tack-only classes, requiring a Peruvian saddle. In all classes, the Peruvian tack must be consistent. Horses must use a Peruvian bit or Bozal, regardless of tack. Bozal may not be used with English saddle. For Peruvian tack, the rider's attire will be a white shirt and pants, Peruvian hat, scarf, and appropriate color boots and poncho or jacket (in bozal, no poncho, spurs, or jacket allowed) or clothing appropriate for the tack used (see NAPHA rules). For ladies, a white split riding skirt may be substituted for white pants. With Western tack, lariat and hobbles are not mandatory. Equestrian hard hats are allowed in all classes. No spurs in bareback, but pads without stirrups are allowed. Tapaderos (leather stirrups) are acceptable in all classes.

Juniors: Classes – 3, 4, 15, 16, 24, 25, 31, 32, 46, 47

A Junior is between the ages of 6 and 17 as of January 1st, 2024. No Junior under 15 on January 1st, 2024 may show a stallion. No ungelded males over 12 months may be shown in any class designated solely for Juniors, nor may spurs be used. Retrancas are prohibited for Juniors in any class; baticola is required, and floron is optional. **Helmets are mandatory for Juniors 12 and under and encouraged for 13 and over.** Leather-covered Peruvian stirrups (tapaderos) are permitted in any class. Classes are divided 6 to 12 and 13 to 17. The classes may be combined but judged separately. Juniors 15 to 17 may ride in Barridas, but signed consent must be given on the show entry form. Juniors may not compete in Novicio Division classes.

Junior High Point and Reserve Award

Junior High Point and Reserve is an award for the Junior receiving the most points from classes: 3, 4, 15, 16, 24, 25, 31, 32, 46, and 47 only, and is calculated as follows: 1st = 10 pts, 2nd = 8 pts, 3rd = 5 pts, 4th = 3 pts, 5th = 2 pts. Juniors participating in regular classes will not receive extra points. High Point classes are divided 6 to 12 years and 13 to 17 years of age. Age divisions may be combined but judged separately. Juniors may not enter Novicio Division Classes. Ties will result in a ride-off.

Novicio (Novice): Classes – 7, 21, 28, 49

Must use the same animal in all Novicio classes to qualify for the High Point award. Open to all genders, bit or bozal (bozal 3 – 4 years). Points: 1st = 5 pts, 2nd = 4 pts, 3rd = 3 pts, 4th = 2 pts, and 5th = 1 pt. Ties will result in a ride-off. Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Novices" must have a signed NAPHA Novice Declaration on file with NAPHA before the NPHC show starts. Novices must file this form annually. An exhibitor, 18 years and over, can compete in the Novice Division for 3 years. If the Novice, at the end of 3 years, has not competed in more than 8 NAPHA-approved shows, they may extend the time period for another 3 years. Double shows count as one show. However, if at any time, a Novice competes and wins a Champion title in gait, breeding, or performance (any other Division above the Novice level), they will be immediately excluded from competing in the Novice Division at future shows. NPHC Amateur Owner Stakes (\$250 guaranteed purse): Class – 1

Entry fee is \$55. The rider must be an NPHC member, registered as the owner (or immediate family) of the horse, and an amateur with the Amateur Declaration on file with NAPHA. Prize money is to be divided as follows: 1st = 50%, 2nd = 30%, 3rd = 20% of the entry fees. Judged as a Breeding Class, Bozal is allowed as a non-qualifying class. No refunds unless the horse is withdrawn from remaining classes with a vet's excuse.

Bozal: Classes – 2, 8, 20, 40, 45

The same horse shall not be shown in both bit and bozal at the same show. Only horses 3 to 4 years old are permitted to show in bozal. First and second place qualifies for Best Bozal Horse of Show, class 61. Bozal horses are allowed in classes: 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 15, 16, 20, 21, 24, 25, 28, 31, 32, 40, 44a, 44b, 45, 46, 49, 59. No Jackets, ponchos, pellons, or spurs are allowed.

Breeding and Luxury Division: Classes – 5, 17, 19, 27, 41, 42, 48

Horses must be finished in bit and at least 4 years of age. Open to professionals and amateurs. All male horses 4 and older, must be registered as a Breeding Stallion or Gelding. No spayed mares may be shown as a Breeding Mare. All qualifying and Championship classes in this division will be Peruvian Tack classes. Confirmation 27%; Condition 5%; Brio and Temperament 27%; Gait 41%.

Performance Division: Classes – 14, 30, 36, 38, 39, 43

Horses must be in bit. These classes are open to professionals and amateurs. Past Ch of Ch horses may enter the Ch of Ch class. Condition 10%; Performance, Brio, Suitability and Manners 50%; Gait 40%

Versatility High Point: Classes – 12, 18, 34, 37, 39, 50

An entry consists of one horse ridden by the same exhibitor in qualifying classes. Participants must register at the office and pay \$15 before class 4. Points are as follows: 1st = 5 pts, 2nd = 4 pts, 3rd = 3 pts, 4th = 2 pts, and 5th = 1 pt. A tie will result in a ride-off.

Crystal Horse 13+: Class – 9

Open to all genders, 13 years and over as of 1 January 2024, in bit. This class is intended to recognize the mature horse. It is judged as a Breeding/Luxury Class but is a non-qualifying class. A Crystal trophy will be awarded.

Professional High Point: Classes – 5, 10, 14, 17, 23, 26, 27, 30, 33, 38, 41, 42, 48, 50

An entry consists of a Professional rider who can ride any horse in any of the classes listed. The award is based on the rider in qualifying classes. Participants must register at the office and pay \$15 before class 4. Points are as follows: 1st = 5 pts, 2nd = 4 pts, 3rd = 3 pts, 4th = 2 pts, and 5th = 1 pt. A tie will result in a ride-off.

Luxury Gelding Stakes (\$250 guaranteed purse): Class – 11

Horses in bit, only. Entry fee is \$55. Prize money is to be divided as follows: 1st = 50%, 2nd = 30%, 3rd = 20% of the purse. Judged as a Breeding Class. No refunds unless the horse is withdrawn from remaining classes with a vet's excuse.

NPHC Amateur High Point Rider: Classes – 6a, 6b, 19, 29a, 29b, 35, 44a, 44b

An entry consists of **one horse** ridden by the **same exhibitor** in qualifying classes. Participants must register at the office and pay \$15 before class 4. Points are as follows: 1st = 5 pts, 2nd = 4 pts, 3rd = 3 pts, 4th = 2 pts, and 5th = 1 pt. A tie will result in a ride-off.

Trail: Class – 12 – Award Presentation

Open to horses 4 and over in bit, for both amateurs and professionals. No ponchos, although jackets are allowed. Three refusals are allowed before the rider must proceed to the next obstacle. Setup in the Outside Arena from 8:30 am to 12 noon on Friday.

Reining: Classes – 23, 24, 25

Open to horses 4 and over, in bit, both amateurs and professionals. If used, the poncho is to be folded on the saddle (optional). Spurs are optional except for Juniors, who may not use them. Juniors may enter a bozal horse in Junior classes.

Gait: Classes – 10, 26, 33, 35 (NQ – Juniors 14, 15, Novicio 30, Bozal 31- Can Not ride in Best Gaited - 68)

Open to horses 4 and over in bit, both amateur and professional. 1st and 2nd place qualify for Best Gaited Horse of Show (68). Judged 100% on gait. Juniors may show a bozal horse in Junior classes.

Amateur Performance: Classes – Levels 1 & 2 – 6a, 6b, 29a, 29b, 44a, 44b

Level 1 qualifications are less than Three (3) Ch. of Ch. titles in both NAPHA and PHAC in any of the following Performance classes: Amateur, Open, Breeding/Luxury, AOTR, and AOTR Breeding/Luxury Performance classes. If you have more than Three (3) Ch. of Ch. Titles in any of the above classes, you are considered a Level 2. **MUST DECLARE LEVEL 1 or 2 and CAN NOT CHANGE LEVELS DURING THE SHOW. Fill out the attached form.** The class will be judged the same as the Performance class, but the rider must be an amateur with an Amateur Declaration. Give your declaration to Willie when you sign up for your classes. The declaration **MUST** be received before the NPHC show starts. Willie will send declarations to NAPHA. Winners qualify for the Amateur Performance Championship (53 or 56). Entries to be judged on Performance, Brio, Suitability, and Manners 50%; Gait and Smoothness 40%; Condition 10%.

Costume: Class – 37

Entries will be limited to no more than 3 horses per entry. All horses must do a walk, Paso Llano, or Sobreandando as requested by the Judge during the working portion of the class and must exhibit manners appropriate for the safety of all exhibitors. This class will not qualify for any championships. You are allowed to Walk in, but you must be able to show your horse in the gait that the judge asks for. To be judged 50% on costume (originality, authenticity, and detail); 30% on execution; and 20% on manners.

Lead Line: Class – 13

Lead Line classes are open to children 6 years of age or younger as of 1 January 2024. The minimum age for participation as a rider in a Lead Line class shall be 2 years old. (See Junior Section for age explanation.) Tack and Attire will be the same as for all regular classes except that the “tapadero” type stirrups are allowed with Peruvian tack and traditional Spanish/Peruvian costume is allowed. Children must wear a helmet, with bicycle-type helmets being acceptable. The horse shall enter the ring with the child mounted and an adult holding a lead line attached to a halter worn under the bridle. Clubs are encouraged to require two walkers at the sides of a Lead Line rider but only one holding the lead line.

Silver Fox – Riders 50+: Class – 43

Judged as a Performance Class for bit horses. Rider to be at least 50 years of age as of 1 January 2024.

Champagne: Classes – 49, 50

Open to all genders, in bit or bozal. A poncho or jacket is optional.

Championships: Classes – 51 to 58

Open to winners of 1st and 2nd place in all classes qualifying for classes 52 to 60. All Breeding and Luxury Division Classes are Peruvian Tack classes, although a pella is not required.

Champion of Champions: Classes – 60 to 67

Open to current and past Champions from the NPHC Regional Show and PPHRNA, NAPHA, and PHAC National Shows. Past Champions may not compete in qualifying classes for their division, if they wish to enter directly, but may enter other division classes. Those entering directly as past Champions and not entered in any other classes at this show must pay an entry fee of \$80 for members and \$125 for non-members. Those entering directly as past Champions and also entered as unlimited in other non-qualifying classes are covered by their unlimited entry fee. **Proof of past Championships must accompany the entry form.** All Breeding and Luxury Division Classes are Peruvian Tack classes – Whites and ponchos or jackets are required. NAPHA Rules do not require horses to complete in the Prueba to enter the Championships, therefore this show will not require one.

Stallions

Male horses 4 years of age or older as of 1 January 2024 must be registered as a stallion or gelding. Registration papers indicating “male” will not be considered acceptable registration papers. The only exceptions will be male horses entered in Colts 3 – 4 in Bozal. Spayed mares may not be shown as breeding mares. No Juniors under the age of 15, as of 1 January 2024, may show a stallion in any class. No ungelded males over 12 months may be shown in a class designated for Juniors only. Horses are considered 1 year of age on January 1st of the year following their birth.

Friday Night: NPHC Annual Meeting – One Hour after the Last Class of the day.

The NPHC Annual meeting will be held one hour after the last class on Friday night. It will be held at the white tent in the RV parking area. We will have tables set up and some finger snacks. Please bring a drink or two and join us! Would love to hear questions or concerns.

NEW THIS YEAR: FRIDAY FUN NIGHT – 7 pm in the Main Arena. \$30 to Enter and Pay at the door – All types of different Fun Classes to include: Barrel Racing, Egg Stomp, Tree Grab, and Ride a Five - \$5 minimum or any other denomination you want to ride with. The winner takes all the cash.

Saturday Night: Potluck, Live Auction, and Raffle – 6 p.m.

The Potluck will start at 6 p.m. at the white tent at the end of the RV Parking. Please bring your BBQ, food, drinks, and something to share with everyone. NOVICE DECLARATION FORM

NAPHA Show Rules

Sec. 17. Novice Rule.

Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Novices" only must have a signed, NAPHA Novice Declaration on file with the NAPHA. **Novices must file this form annually.**

An exhibitor (18 years and older) can compete in the Novice Division for a period of 3 years. If the Novice, at the end of 3 years has not competed in more than 8 NAPHA approved shows during that period they may extend the time period for another 3 years (double shows count as one show). However, if at any time, a Novice competes and wins a Champion title in gait, breeding, or performance (any other Division above the level of Novice) they will be immediately excluded from competing in the Novice Division at future shows.

PROFESSIONAL STATUS

Professional status is based on one's own activity along with another's. A person is deemed a professional after his 18th birthday, if he accepts remuneration for his spouse, family member, or cohabitant engaging in any activity enumerated in 1 a-l below. For the purposes of this rule, the term cohabitant is defined as any individuals living together in a relationship, as would a married couple, but not legally married. **See PART X GLOSSARY OF TERMS Sec. 2. for the complete definition of Amateur and Professional, in the NAPHA Show Rules.**

Professional. Based on one's own activities, unless expressly permitted as listed in the definition of Amateur, a person is a professional if after his 18th birthday he/she does any of the following:

- a. Accepts remuneration AND rides, exercises, drives, shows, trains, assists in training, schools or conducts clinics or seminars.
- b. Accepts remuneration AND gives riding or driving lessons, showmanship lessons, equitation lessons, trains horses, or provides consultation services in riding, driving, showmanship, equitation, or training of horses.
- c. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an employee in a position such as a groom, farrier, bookkeeper, veterinarian or barn manager AND instructs, rides, drives, shows, trains or schools horses that are owned, boarded or trained by his employer, any member of his employer's family, or a business in which his employer has an ownership interest.
- d. Accepts remuneration AND uses his name, photograph or other form of personal association as a horseperson in connection with any advertisement or product/service for sale, including but not limited to apparel, equipment or property.
- e. Accepts prize money unless permitted in paragraph 3d or 3e for Amateur activities stated above.
- f. Rides, drives or shows any horse that a cohabitant or family member or a cohabitant or family member's business receives remuneration for boarding, training, riding, driving or showing. A cohabitant or family member of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer.
- g. Gives instruction to any person or rides, drives, or shows any horse, for which activity his cohabitant or another person in his family or business in which his cohabitant or a family member controls will receive remuneration for the activity. A cohabitant or family members of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer.
- h. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an agent in the sale of a horse or pony or accepts a horse or pony on consignment for the purpose of sale or training that is not owned by him, his cohabitant, or a member of his family, a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation/business in which he, his cohabitant or a member of his family controls.
- i. Advertises one's equestrian services such as training or instruction.
- j. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an intern, apprentice, or working student whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to, riding, driving, showmanship, handling, showing, training or assisting in training, giving lessons/coaching and/or schooling horses other than horses actually owned by him.
- k. Accepts remuneration in excess of rental fee for use of a facility, ring or school horses.
- l. Accepts remuneration for such use AND uses commercial logoed items while on competition grounds unless expressly permitted by applicable division rules.

DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS

Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Amateurs" only must have a signed NAPHA Amateur Declaration on file with the NAPHA. Amateurs must file annually. Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur if after their 18th birthday they have not engaged in any of the activities identified in PART X Glossary of Terms, Section 10 Professional. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under NAPHA rules must be listed on the NAPHA website as an Amateur or have signed a NAPHA Amateur Declaration and filed it with the show secretary, prior to the start of the show that morning of the class entered. Amateur status will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur status. **See PART X GLOSSARY OF TERMS Sec. 2. for the complete definition of Amateur and Professional, in the NAPHA Show Rules.**

- 1) **Remuneration. Remuneration is defined as compensation or payment in any form such as cash, goods, sponsorships, discounts or services; reimbursement of any expenses; trade or in-kind exchange of goods or services such as board or training.**
- 2) **Permitted activities by an Amateur. An Amateur is permitted to do the following:**
 - a. Accept reimbursement for actual expenses associated with conducting classroom seminars for a not-for-profit organization, therapeutic riding programs, or programs for charitable organizations approved in advance by NAPHA.
 - b. Act as a camp counselor when not hired in the exclusive capacity as a riding instructor; give instruction or training to handicapped riders for therapeutic purposes.
 - c. Appear in advertisements and/or articles related to acknowledgement of one's own personal or business sponsorship of a competition and/or awards earned by one's owned horses. (example: An amateur may appear on a non-owned horse but must not receive remuneration.)
 - d. Accept prize money as the owner of a horse in any class other than equitation or showmanship classes.
 - e. Accept a non-monetary token gift of appreciation valued less than \$300 annually.
 - f. Serve as an intern for college credit or course requirements at an accredited institution provided one has never held professional status with NAPHA or any other equestrian National Federation. In addition, one may accept reimbursement for expenses without profit, as prescribed by the educational institution's program, for the internship.
 - g. Write books or articles related to horses.
 - h. Accept remuneration for providing service in one's capacity as a: competition manager, competition secretary, judge, steward, announcer, TV commentator, veterinarian, groom, farrier, tack shop operator, breeder, or boarder, or horse transporter
 - i. Accept reimbursement for any bona fide expenses directly related to the horse (i.e. farrier/vet bills, entries). Travel, hotel, equipment, and room and board are not considered bona fide expenses.

This declaration must be filled out **Every Year** for the show season.

All Amateur exhibitors/Riders are required to declare their level (1 or 2) riding status before the beginning of the current show season. Also, a signed NAPHA Amateur declaration form must be on file with NAPHA or completed before the start of the show. This form will not be sufficient for that requirement. The criteria for Level declaration are as follows:

Amateur Level 1: These are Exhibitor/Rider who HAVE NOT won more than three (3) Champion of Champions titles from any NAPHA or PHAC-approved show, in Amateur Performance, Open Performance, Breeding/Luxury, AOTR Performance, and AOTR Breeding/Luxury classes. (Best Gaited and Best Bozal are not included).

All exhibitors/riders who are current NAPHA-carded Judges must declare Level 2. All Riders who have regained their Amateur status from Professional status in the last 10 years must compete in Level 2.

General Rules:

If a horse qualifies for a Champion/Reserve and Champion of Champions class with a Level 1 rider, only a Level 1 rider can complete the competition in that division. A returning Champion of Champions must choose the level they will compete in and cannot change levels. Different Level 1 riders can compete on the same horse for that division. If a horse qualifies in the Amateur division with riders of both Level 1 and Level 2, they can only compete in Championships of one level and must stay with that level rider in Champion and Champion of Champions. IE: If you win the Champion award in Level 2, you can only compete in Champion of Champions Level 2.

Exhibitors/Riders MUST qualify for the level they compete in. IE: An exhibitor/Rider with less than three (3) Champion of Champions titles CANNOT choose to compete in Level 2 as they do not qualify for Level 2. Levels cannot change during the show.

If an exhibitor/rider starts the year at Level 1 but surpasses the three (3) Champion of Champions titles required during the show year at any NAPHA or approved Canadian show, They are allowed to compete at Level 1 for the remainder of the current show year.

If any exhibitor/rider questions and chooses to protest a rider at either level, it will be up to that exhibitor/rider to present their evidence to the Show Committee. If the committee affirms the violation of a level status, that exhibitor may face DISQUALIFICATION of wins for that particular show and must return all Amateur Level awards to the club.
