APPROVALS & POINTS

This show is approved and hosted by the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada (PHAC). Qualified entries (PHAC registered horses owned by PHAC members in good standing) receive TRIPLE points towards PHAC awards in the Breeding, Gait, Pleasure and Performance divisions. It is approved as a regular show by North American Peruvian Horse Association (NAPHA); qualified entries will receive points towards Medallion de Plata and Medallion de Oro Awards in Breeding, Gait, Performance and High Point Annual Awards. Please note that Champions and Champion of Champions at this show are eligible for their respective Champion of Champions classes at the 2024 US National Show.

RESPONSIBILITY

All entries are accepted with the understanding that the PHAC, NAPHA, members of the show committee and the Armstrong Spallumcheen Parks and Recreation (ASPR) will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that in any way may be lost, destroyed or damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to a property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including lawyer and court costs, that may arise out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of any such horse.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Everything possible is being done to conduct this show on the highest possible level for the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators. The PHAC is most desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return ask for cooperation of all in helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event. This show will be run under PHAC show rules. Every person who participates is responsible for the knowledge of the PHAC rules and regulations and is subject to the rules and regulations of the following documents:

1. The PHAC By-Laws
2. The PHAC Book of Peruvian Horse Showing – Updated 2021
3. The Peruvian Horse Breed Standard and the PHAC Code of Ethics

Copies of any of these can be downloaded free of charge from the PHAC website, please visit www.phac.ca. In any case where this Premium List appears to be in conflict with the PHAC rules, then the documents mentioned above take precedence.

MEMBERSHIP & REGISTRATIONS REQUIREMENTS

Non-members of the PHAC are eligible to participate in this event but will be charged non-member fees. Horses registered or pending with the PHAC are eligible to be shown. Horses owned by residents of Canada MUST be registered or pending with the PHAC. Horses owned by residents of other countries are eligible to be shown provided they are registered with certificates from PHAC, AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA or are pending with NAPHA. Owners in arrears with PHAC or NAPHA WILL NOT be allowed to show until arrears are cleared.

Membership Applications can be completed and paid for on the PHAC website prior to the show, please visit www.phac.ca/forms. Exhibitors may also go to the Show Office and complete an application and pay the membership dues. An annual membership to the PHAC is \$55.

COMPLAINTS & PROTESTS

All complaints and/or protests shall be taken directly to the Show Manager. Protests must be filed in writing to the Show Manager within 48 hours of the close of the show and must be accompanied by a fee of \$100 which may be refunded if the grievance is upheld.

DRUG TESTING

THIS IS A DRUG-FREE show. There will be drug testing at this show. Drug testing fees are included in entries.

SUBSTITUTION OF JUDGES AND OTHER OFFICIALS

In the event that the judge or other official designed herein is unable to perform his/her duties due to circumstances beyond his/her control or for any other reason, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute another approved judge or official in his/her place.

JUDGES AUTHORITY

The Judge(s) shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The awards shall be placed on the horses as they are seen presented in the ring for each class, without regard to previous performances and records. The Judge shall award prizes in order first to fifth according to merit and may not vacate places. If there are more horses of merit in a class than there are prizes offered in that class, the Judge has the right to award honourable mentions. The Judge may make favourable comments over the PA system about the horses shown before him/her but shall make no negative comments. Judges are not permitted to ride any horse entered in this show, during the show.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Horses entering Canada from the United States require a negative coggins test (blood drawn within the previous six months) and an international health certificate endorsed by a veterinarian showing examination within the 30 days prior to entry. This process can take as long as three weeks so please plan ahead. Exhibitors and their veterinarians are encouraged to call the Canadian Federal Veterinarian of the border crossing of their choice for clarification. For health paper requirements, the physical address of the Armstrong Agriplex is 3351 Park Drive, Armstrong BC V0E 1B0.

STABLING

Stalls will be bedded for you and ready to use by Thursday, August 8 at 8:00 AM. Please advise Lynn Moker if you plan to arrive earlier. Each horse requires a separate stall (except broodmare with suckling foal). All exhibitors are advised to bring feed, snaps, buckets, hay nets, wheelbarrows and all other items necessary for the care of their horses. All exhibitors shall see that their horses are maintained in a suitable manner while on the show grounds. Stall fees include

extra shavings throughout the weekend as needed and the clean-out at the end of the show. **Please note: Stalls are NO LONGER included in entry fee. Bedded stalls are NON-REFUNDABLE. All reserved stalls shall be bedded. If you cancel an entry after noon on Tuesday August 6th for ANY reason, you will be invoiced by the PHAC a fee of \$30 per stall. Any stalls booked after Tuesday August 6 will be assigned at the show and will not be bedded for you.**

FACILITY

The main arena and the warm up arena (ring #2) will be available for use from Thursday, August 8. Cold water wash racks are located at the ends of barns 1, 2 and 3.

FACILITY RULES

1. Smoking is NOT PERMITTED in the barn area at any time.
2. All dogs must be leashed, tied or in a secure pen or kennel at all times. Dogs will be removed from inside the arena if causing a disturbance or distraction.
3. Owners are required to pick up after their dogs.
4. Alcohol is NOT ALLOWED inside the arena.
5. Do not nail anything to existing structures.
6. Remove all tack, staples, hooks etc. which may be used or decorating, notices etc. Remove any decorations or notices, schedules.
7. Animals, hay nets or buckets are not to be tied to mesh stall fronts.
8. Alterations or repairs to electrical outlets, lights, equipment are not permitted.

CAMPING/PARKING

Camping with power and water hookups is available on the grounds at a cost of \$30 per night. Dry camping site are available for \$22 per night.

SHOW OFFICE

The Show office is in the Recreational Vehicle located next to the arena entrance and will be open at 5:00 PM on Thursday, August 8 for exhibitors to post enter and to pick up exhibitor packages.

The office will open one hour prior to the scheduled start of each morning and afternoon session. Exhibitors are NOT allowed to register for a class at the gate, but are allowed to scratch a class at the gate. To give additional time to add or change classes, the office will also be open half an hour prior to the start of each morning and afternoon intermission but will close when the 10-minute intermission begins to allow the show secretary time to print off class sheets for officials.

HOSPITALITY

There will be no hospitality or concessions offered at this show. There are several local restaurants in Armstrong and Askew's Foods can provide all your grocery needs. Askew's is also a show sponsor who is providing free water and ice at the arena to keep us all cool and hydrated.

PHAC ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING & 2023 HIGH POINT AWARDS PRESENTATION

The PHAC AGM & Awards Presentation will be held on Friday August 9 under the white tents on the grounds. The meeting will begin 90 minutes after the last class of the day. Pizza will be provided compliments of the PHAC. We encourage all members to attend.

EQUINE MASSAGE

SATURDAY EVENING MEXICAN TACO NIGHT DINNER

Please join us on Saturday August 10th at 7:00 PM for a MEXICAN TACO NIGHT on the show grounds. Dinner is hosted by Paradise Ranch and is FREE for all exhibitors and their staff, all riders and volunteers. Visitors are asked to make a donation to the PHAC in lieu of payment. Please confirm your attendance/number of tickets required with your entries by August 5th.

SILENT AUCTION

Please bring any auction items you would like to donate and give to Nancy Cox or Penny Clayton once you arrive at the show. We ask that you pay for any purchased items before you leave the show grounds. We thank you for supporting this very important fund-raising event.

SHOW SAFETY

The personal safety of our participants, officials, spectators and horses is first and foremost a priority for the Show Committee. It is the expectation that you come to the show prepared and ready to show. We ask that these other general rules are followed while on the grounds.

1. Obey all notices and signs.
2. Follow the direction of the Gate Admissions Steward, Ring Steward and Show Manager at all times.
3. No riding in barn alleyways.
4. If at all possible, please tack and untack your horse in its stall.
5. Please practice ring courtesy and maintain a safe distance from other horses.
6. On any horse ridden by a junior in any class, retrancas are prohibited, baticola is required, floron is optional. Helmets are mandatory for junior riders 12 & under as well as any junior in a lead line class that does not have a spotter.
7. Helmets are optional for all riders.
8. At the end of each class, exhibitors will remain in the line up in the centre of the arena to receive their ribbons and awards, and will exit the arena together. A victory lap for the class winner will be allowed.

GATE RULES/ETIQUETTE

In order to stay on schedule, we ask that you:

1. Adhere to the 3-minute gate rule (strictly enforced). It is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure the Ring Admission's Steward has your correct name, horse name and exhibitor number by the third call for the class.
2. An additional 5-minute tack change can be requested in advance. Please bring sufficient tack and helpers.

3. You may not register for a class at the gate, all entries must be done at the show office. You may however, scratch a class at the gate.
4. Note that the Ring Admission Steward /show Manager ONLY has the authority to allow or deny entry after the gate has been closed. All discrepancies will be settled by the Show manager.

SHOW RULES

All participants at this show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of current rules and regulations. All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions, descriptions of tack and attire, conduct and ethics and conditions for this show are available on the PHAC website at www.phac.ca. Please check for 2021 updates. Any horse winning first or second in Breeding/Luxury classes will automatically be entered into and must show in their respective Zootecnico (conformation) class. Any returning Champion of Champions in Breeding/Luxury will also automatically be entered and must show in their respective Zootecnico class. A list of entries in the Zootecnico classes will be posted outside the show office at the end of the day on Saturday. Please check to ensure that your horse is entered as you will not be allowed to enter the class at the gate.

During the show, please take all class rule questions that arise directly to the Show Manager/Steward. Please take all complaints and/or protests directly to the Show Manager.

ALTERNATE HALTER CLASS PROCEDURE

A limit of four horses shall enter the arena at one time. Each horse will enter the arena at a walk, line up and stand for conformation judging. Exhibitors will then move to an area of the arena where they have sufficient space and will lunge their horse at the announcer's call. Horses will be asked to gait, stop, reverse, gait, stop, walk and stop again, and will be asked to line up for final judging. The Judge may call for horses to be run off by lunging, but not by the handler being required to run with the horse. Note: Actions that may disturb other entries such as lunging circles before the announcer calls for the movement, or when asked to line up or stopping intentionally, shall be forbidden and may be penalized by a lower placing or being excused. Any action that creates an unsafe situation of contact between two horses shall be grounds for dismissal.

RIBBONS, AWARDS & PRIZES

Large, distinctive ribbons will be awarded in each class 1st through 5th place. Distinctive awards for High Point winners, Champions and Champion of Champions, Best Bozal and Best Gait will be awarded. ****NEW** We recycle. Help us keep costs down and unwanted ribbons out of the landfill by returning any unwanted ribbons to the show office at the end of the show.**

LUXURY GELDING STAKES IN BIT - \$50 ENTRY FEE (\$250 cash added to purse)

To be judged as per Luxury Gelding division rules and only open to geldings born in North America. Prize money to be awarded from a percentage of proceeds from entries and donations to be divided as follows:

1st – 40%, 2nd – 25%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%, 5th – 5%.

BREEDING MARES OR STALLIONS' STAKES IN BIT - \$50 ENTRY FEE (\$250 cash added to purse)

To be judged as per Luxury/Breeding division rules. Prize money to be awarded from a percentage of proceeds from entries and donations to be divided as follows:

1st – 40%, 2nd – 25%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%, 5th – 5%.

MYSTERY CASH CLASSES

There are eight mystery cash classes at this show. Classes, placings and cash amount are random and will be announced once all horses have entered the arena at the beginning of the class. Stakes classes, Champion and Reserve, and Champion of Champions classes are not included.

HIGH POINT JUNIOR AWARD 12 & UNDER AND HIGH POINT JUNIOR 13 & OVER

****NEW**** Show Entry fees (including office fees, drug testing, and exhibitor fees) for junior riders have been WAIVED at this show. Horses owned/leased/borrowed and ridden ONLY by a junior are eligible. This does not apply to stalls/stabling. High Point Junior awards will be presented to the junior exhibitor who has accumulated the most points in the junior classes in their age division at this show. Points will be awarded 1 through 6 in each class (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). Shod horses are allowed in junior classes. Ties will be broken, first by the number of firsts and seconds, and if there is still a tie, then a ride off at the judge's discretion will decide the winner.

****NEW**** Exhibitors 12 & Under may have a spotter accompany them into the arena for the duration of the class. Spotter may walk along side exhibitor during the class but is there for support only and must not touch or assist junior in any way.

HIGH POINT NOVICE AWARD

A High Point Novice award will be presented to the novice exhibitor who has accumulated the most points in the novice classes listed below. Points will be awarded 1 through 6 in each class (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). Juniors are not allowed to compete in novice classes. Shod horses are allowed in novice classes. Ties will be broken, first by the number of firsts and seconds, and if there is still a tie, then a ride off at the judge's discretion will decide the winner.

1. NTR, Bit or Bozal Equitation
2. NTR, Bit or Bozal - Breed/Luxury
3. NTR, Champagne/Evian
4. NTR, Bit or Bozal - Gait
5. NTR, Bit or Bozal – Pleasure

HIGH POINT AMATEUR AWARD

The High Point Amateur Award is open to all riders with amateur status. You must register (no charge) at the office in order to compete for this award. High Points will be calculated from the top 5 places in the classes listed below. Ties will be broken by a ride off judged on equitation and performance.

1. Open Amateur to Ride in Bit – Pleasure
2. Mares 4+ Yrs in B it – Pleasure
3. Open Amateur to Ride in Bit – Breed/Luxury
4. Geldings 4+ Yrs in B it – Pleasure
5. Stallions 4+ Yrs in Bit – Pleasure
6. Open Amateur to Ride in Bit - Gait

HIGH POINT VERSATILITY HORSE AWARD

This award is being offered to promote breed versatility and encourage thorough and well-rounded training of the Peruvian Horse, part bloods and other gaited breeds. Open to junior, novice, amateur or professional riders. Points will be awarded 1 through 6 in each class (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). Shod horses are allowed in Versatility classes. Ties will be broken, first by number of firsts and seconds, and if there is still a tie, then by the placing in the trail class. The Versatility Division at this show is open to all gaited part-bloods and other gaited horses. Part-bloods and other gaited horses will be awarded class placings, High Point Versatility Awards but will not be eligible for PHAC lifetime points. A reduced entry fee is available to gaited part-bloods and other gaited horses competing in the Versatility Division who wish to show out of their trailer on Saturday. In order to compete for the High Point Versatility Horse Award, a horse must be entered into at least two of the versatility classes. Please note that there is a separate Premium List for those that are participating in the Versatility Division ONLY. Please visit [Coming Events - Peruvian Horse Association Canada, Breed Info, Membership \(phac.ca\)](#). If you are showing in any other division as well as Versatility, please continue using this document.

****NEW**** Attire for the Versatility Division ONLY has been relaxed at this show. Attire may include conservative-coloured jeans or breeches, long or short sleeved button up shirt, boots with heels, helmet or brimmed hat.

1. Champagne Pairs (Bit or Bozal) – Maneuvers will be called for including but not limited to circles, stops, backing, figure eights and reverses while carrying a glass of champagne. Riders will be asked to pass off glass to partner during class. Judged as a champagne class.
2. Two Gait Country Pleasure (Bit or Bozal) – Judged as a pleasure class. On a loose rein, walk, paso llano/middle gait, stop, reserve (both sides) line up and back up when asked.
3. Freestyle – no required patterns or elements. Music may be used, maximum time allowed must not exceed 2.5 minutes per exhibitor.
4. Trail Class (Bit or Bozal) – Horses will be scored from 0 to 5 points for each obstacle they complete. High points will be awarded for confident, smooth and relaxed performances. This is not a timed event and excessive speed or recklessness will be penalized. After two refusals of an obstacle, horse and rider must proceed to the next obstacle. Safety is of utmost importance. Retranças are optional if using a Peruvian saddle, helmets are encouraged. See the pattern at the back of this document.
5. Musical Rings – This class is run as the game Musical Chairs. Large circles are drawn on the ground, one less than there are exhibitors. While music is played, horses stay on the rail in gait. When music stops, exhibitors must get at least two of their horse's feet inside the circle. One horse per circle. Exhibitor not in a circle is eliminated. The class ends when there is one horse left in the arena.

HIGH POINT PROFESSIONAL AWARD

The High Point Professional Award is for professionals only. You must register (no charge) at the office in order to compete for this award. Points will be calculated from best placings in one class from each division as follows:

1. Best placing in a Zootechnico Class
2. Best placing in a Halter Class
3. Best placing in a Bozal Class
4. Best placing in a Breeding or Luxury Class
5. Best placing in a Performance Class
6. Best placing in a Gait Class

HIGH POINT HORSE AWARD

The High Point Horse Award has been officially added this year and is open to all bit or bozal horses (no halter horses). Points calculated from best placings in any class that any rider can complete in with the exception of Novice and Junior riders. Ties will be broken first by the number of firsts and seconds, and if there is still a tie, then a ride off at the judge's discretion will decide the winner.

CHAMPION & RESERVE CHAMPION CLASSES

Any Champion of Champions from any PHAC approved show held in Canada may go directly to the Champion & Reserve Class in their respective division at this show.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CLASSES

The Champion of Champions classes are open to the current years champion and past champions of the Canadian National Show, as well as the Champion of Champions from any U.S. National Show. Returning Champion of Champions must submit their entry and pay fees prior to the first class of the show. Any returning Champion entering the Champion of Champions class in the Breeding/Luxury division will be automatically entered and must show in their respective Zootechnico class.

PRUEBA FUNCIONAL

The Prueba Funcional as been suspended at this 2024 Canadian National Show.

Exhibitors will not be charged for any pre-entered horse(s) unable to attend the show.

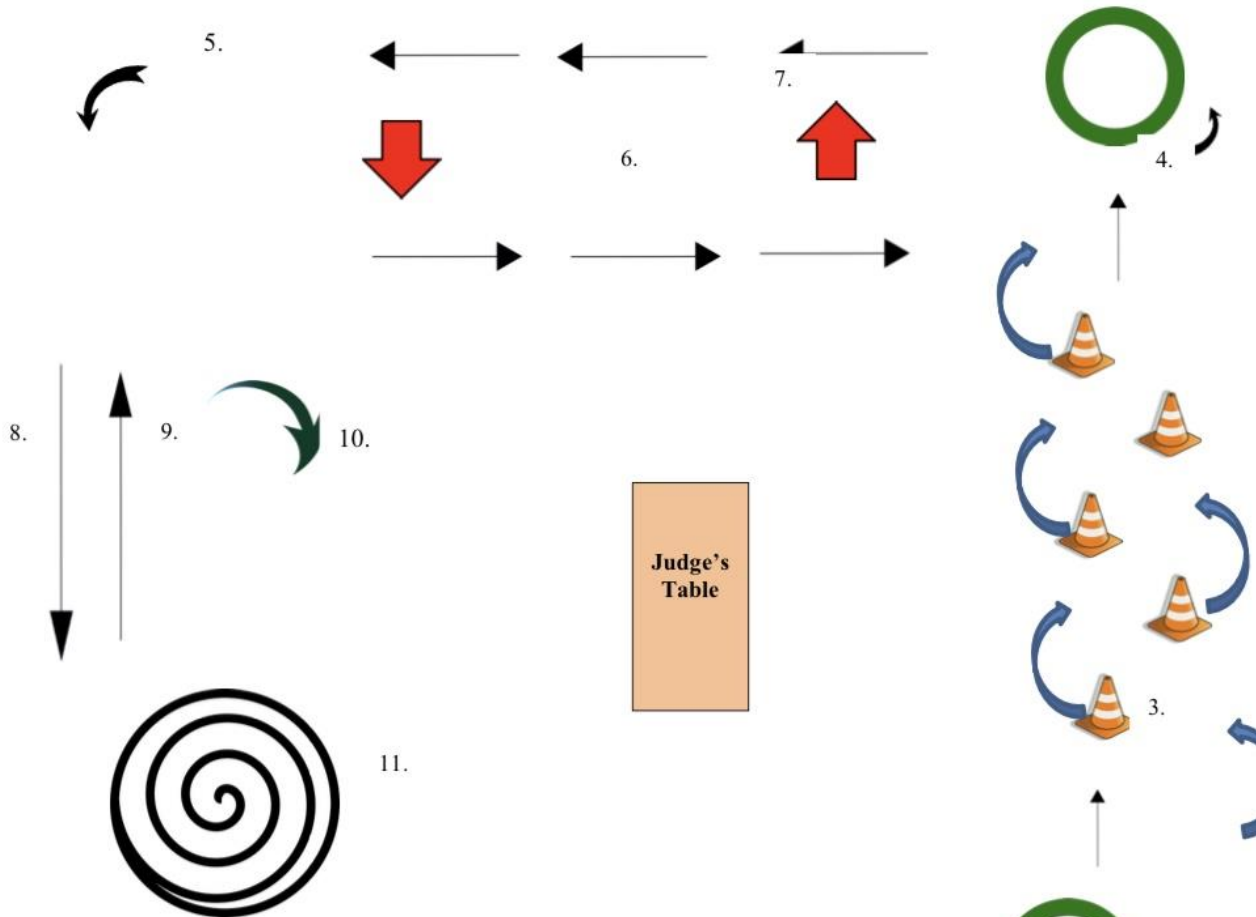

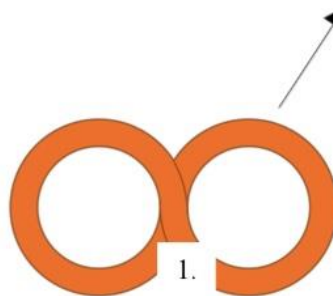

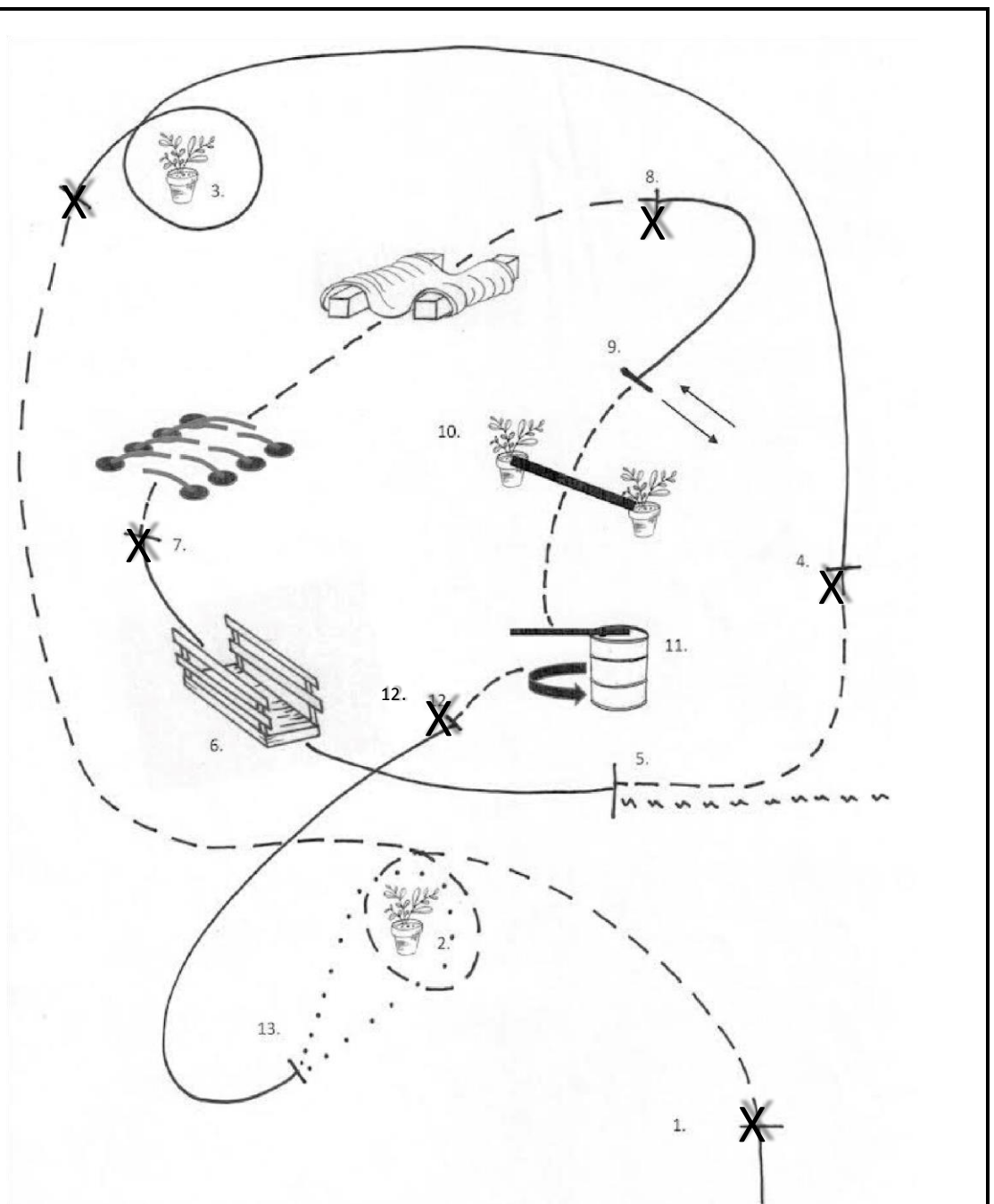


ENTER ARENA - SALUTE JUDGE

5. Gait to 5. and Side pass Left
6. Back 8 steps and Stand quietly
7. Side pass Right, Gait to the rail
8. Walk on a loose rein on the rail
9. Reverse at walk
10. Stop, reverse in place on haunches
11. Caracol in & out (direction rider's choice)
12. Stop, Salute Judge, Exit Arena

Trail Instructions

1. Enter arena in gait. Stop and salute.
2. Proceed at a loose rein walk, completing left hand circle. Proceed on rail at a walk, transition to gait at X (see diagram).
3. Complete right--hand circle in gait.
4. Transition to a walk at X (see diagram).
5. Turn into centre of arena, stop and back 10 steps.
6. Proceed in gait over bridge.
7. Transition to a walk at X, go through underbrush and over river tarp. 8. Proceed in gait at X.
9. Stop, side pass left, then right.
10. Walk over raised pole.
11. Proceed to log push, at a walk make two complete rounds with horse's chest/nose.
12. Proceed in gait at X (see diagram)
13. Stop, dismount, ground tie, rider to walk around flower pot, return to horse. Salute and exit on foot.

# DID YOU KNOW .....

The **“Maple Leaf”** has been used as a national symbol in Canada since 1868 when it appeared on the Coat of Arms of both Ontario and Quebec. The maple leaf was then added to the Canadian Coat of Arms in 1921. In 1965 Canada’s national flag was changed to a red and white flag with a stylized 11-point red male leaf in its centre. The new flag was inaugurated in a public ceremony on Parliament Hill on February 15, 1965.



The **“Canadian Club”** or **“CC”** is an iconic brand that has propelled the Canadian Whiskey category to fame around the world for almost 160 years.



The **“Double Double”** is a coffee order that has become a cultural phenomenon in Canada. It is simply a cup of Tim Horton’s coffee with two creams and two sugars added.



The **“Red Serge”** refers to the jacket of the dress uniform of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). While the modern Mounties’ everyday uniforms are more in line with standard police attire, the wool and satin-lined Red Serge is still used for ceremonial events.



The **“Beaver Tail”** is a fried dough pastry pulled by hand to resemble the flat tail of the beaver. It is then topped with a myriad of delicious garnishes from the classic cinnamon and sugar to whipped cream and Nutella.
